

**RESOLUTION OF THE SISKIYOU COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
PROCLAIMING MAY 2018 AS MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH
IN SISKIYOU COUNTY**

The following resolution is hereby offered and read:

WHEREAS, prevention is an effective way to reduce the burden of mental illnesses; and

WHEREAS, understanding mental health isn't only about being able to identify symptoms and having a name for these conditions but eliminating stigma by dispelling false ideas about mental health conditions as well; and

WHEREAS, each business, school, government agency, healthcare provider, organization and citizen shares the burden of mental illnesses and has a responsibility to reduce stigma, promote mental wellness and support prevention efforts; and

WHEREAS, the local mental health and wellness community, the U.S. Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, the National Alliance on Mental Illness, and Siskiyou County Behavioral Health Department, invite all residents to participate in and celebrate **Mental Health Awareness Month**; and guide those in our community who need mental health care toward the promising path of wellness and recovery.
