

Proposal Narrative

The Siskiyou County Public Defender's Office is a small office with limited resources in a frontier county with unusually high poverty rates, and correspondingly increased utilization of appointed counsel. Unfortunately, the Public Defender's budget allocation is usually approximately 50% of the District Attorney's Office, so the office strives to provide services with limited resources. Additionally, like most other small, rural offices, the Siskiyou County Public Defender's Office struggles with identifying and retaining professional services that larger offices have built into their budgets.

The Legislature has taken a different approach to the criminal justice system over the past several years which provides increased opportunities for incarcerated individuals to re-address their CDCR sentences. While exciting and laudatory, these changes have not come with an increase in funding that would allow for smaller Public Defender offices to provide robust representation in these areas.

The appropriated funding related to these areas is allocated based on the total adult population of each county, so smaller counties --which often struggle for funding received allocations insufficient to hire the sort of professionals needed to assist with

these cases. In light of these limitations, the Siskiyou County Public Defender's Office intends to attempt to use the funding to retain appropriate professional services on a case-by-case basis until the funds are exhausted.
