B. Reimbursement for all types of enforcement activities shall be at the following rates unless specifically stated otherwise:

\$0.655/mile patrolled Per diem rate is \$0/day

Wages at the prevailing rate of \$48.00/hour plus fringe benefits for the individual officer.



Siskiyou County Dispatch will be an unscheduled service, for a flat fee, not to exceed the amount of \$7,000 per year (from KNF total funds.)

II. PATROL ACTIVITIES:

- A. Time schedules for patrols will be flexible to allow for emergencies, other priorities, and day-to-day needs of both the Cooperator and the USDA Forest Service. Ample time will be spent in each area to make residents and visitors aware that law enforcement officers are in the vicinity.
 - 1. Patrol on following USDA Forest Service roads:

Roads designated and maintained by the Forest Service within the cooperator's area of jurisdiction.

2. Patrol in the following campgrounds, developed sites, or dispersed areas:

Area 1: Klamath National Forest

To make vehicle patrols within the KNF, to include campgrounds and public access roads. Time and duration are at the discretion of the patrolling deputy.

- 1. Goosenest Ranger District
 - a. Deer Mountain & Four Corners Snow Parks (winter)
 - b. Juanita Lake Campground (spring, summer, fall)
 - c. Shafter Campground (spring, summer, fall)
- 2. Oak Knoll Ranger District
 - a. Highway 96, Klamath River Corridor Campgrounds (summer)
- 3. Scott River Ranger District
 - a. Scott River Campgrounds (spring, summer, high school graduation)
 - b. Kelsey Creek Day Use Area (summer evenings)
 - c. Lovers Camp Trailhead (summer)
 - d. Kangaroo Lake Campground (summer)
- 4. Happy Camp Ranger District
 - a. River rafting access parking areas (summer, fall)
 - b. Curly Jack campground (spring, summer, fall)
- 5. Ukonom Ranger District
 - a. Salmon and Klamath River rafting parking areas (summer, fall)
 - b. Nordheimer Campground (spring, summer, fall)
 - c. Dillon Creek Campground (summer)
- 6. Salmon River Ranger District



a. Both and North and South Fork of the Salmon River campgrounds, dispersed river camps, trailheads (all areas, spring, summer, fall).

Total reimbursement for this category shall not exceed the amount of: \$46,000. Unused dispatch funds may be used for patrol activities, in which case the maximum reimbursement may not exceed the amount of: \$53,000.

Area 2: Modoc National Forest

To provide vehicular patrols within the Medicine Lake Recreation Area including the Forest Service administration site, campground, boat launching facilities, day use sites, Bulls Eye Lake, Payne Springs, and other areas of concentrated use.

Patrols will normally be scheduled on Fridays and Saturdays between 1400-2000 hours within a duration of four to six hours. Patrols shall begin on or about July 1 and end on or about September 30, 2023. Provide additional patrols on the day before and the first day of deer hunting season.

Total reimbursement for this category shall not exceed the amount of \$10,000 during the indicated period.

Area 3: Shasta - Trinity National Forest

Patrols will be conducted on a no set time basis during the departments normal shift assignments usually between the hours of 1800 and 0600 during the forest's recreation season of May 24 to September 30, 2023. Patrols will occur primarily on weekends, holidays, and other high use periods.

The cooperator agrees to provide at a minimum, patrols during 1 weekday and/or weekend during peak seasonal periods as follows within the Shasta-Trinity.

Total reimbursement for this category shall not exceed \$10,000.

Total overall reimbursement for this OP includes dispatching, all patrol activities, training, and equipment (described below) shall not exceed the total funding amount of \$77,000.



III. TRAINING:

See Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement Provision IV-K for additional information.

Total reimbursement for this category shall not exceed the amount of 10% of the total agreement and shall be approved by the Forest Service Representative (designated or alternate).

Total reimbursement for this category shall not exceed the amount of: \$2,000.00

V. SPECIAL ENFORCEMENT SITUATIONS:

- A. Special Enforcement Situations include but are not limited to: Fire Emergencies, Drug Enforcement, and certain Group Gatherings.
- B. Funds available for special enforcement situations vary greatly from year to year and must be specifically requested and approved prior to any reimbursement being authorized. Requests for funds should be made to the USDA Forest Service designated representative listed in Item I-A of this Operating Plan. The designated representative will then notify **Error! Reference source not found.** whether funds will be authorized for reimbursement. If funds are authorized, the parties will then jointly prepare a revised Operating Plan.
 - 1. Drug Enforcement: This will be handled on a case-by-case basis. The request will normally come from the patrol Captain; however, it may come from the Special Agent in Charge or their designated representative. Reimbursement shall be made at the rates specified in Section I-B. Deputies assigned to the incident will coordinate all of their activities with the designated officer in charge of the incident.
 - 2. Fire Emergency: During emergency fire suppression situations and upon request by the USDA Forest Service pursuant to an incident resource order, the Cooperator agrees to provide special services beyond those provided under Section II-A, within the Cooperator's resource capabilities, for the enforcement of State and local laws related to the protection of persons and their property. The Cooperator will be



compensated at the rate specified in Section I-B; the USDA Forest Service will specify times and schedules. Upon concurrence of the local patrol Captain or their designated representative, an official from the Incident Management Team managing the incident, Cooperator personnel assigned to an incident where meals are provided will be entitled to such meals.

3. Group Gatherings: This includes but is not limited to situations which are normally unanticipated, or which typically include very short notices, large group gatherings such as rock concerts, demonstrations, and organization rendezvous. Upon authorization by a USDA Forest Service representative listed in Section I-A for requested services of this nature, reimbursement shall be made at the rates specified in Section I-B. Deputies assigned to this type of incident will normally coordinate their activities with the designated officer in charge of the incident.

This includes but is not limited to situations which are normally unanticipated, or which typically include very short notice, large group gatherings such as rock concerts, demonstrations, and organizational rendezvous.

VI. BILLING FREQUENCY:

See Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement Provisions II-H and III-B for additional information.

A. The Cooperator will furnish either monthly, quarterly, or no later than December 31st <u>itemized statements</u> of expenses to the USDA Forest Service. These expenditures shall be tied to the reimbursable expenses and the rate schedule, and shall be certified by the Cooperator as being proper. The statements must be completed and accompanied by a Law Enforcement Activity Report, form FS-5300-5 for each billing statement.

II. CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE OPERATIONS:

Pursuant to IV- J of Agreement No. 21-LE-11051360-020, the following is in support of operations to suppress manufacturing and trafficking of controlled substances on or



affecting the administration of National Forest System lands, with an emphasis on identification, apprehension and prosecution of suspects engaged in these activities:

A. The USDA Forest Service agrees:

- 1.To reimburse <u>the Cooperator</u> for expenditures associated with the detection of locations and activities related to illegal production and trafficking of controlled substances, including:
 - a. Ground reconnaissance to identify and inventory locations and activities associated with producing or trafficking controlled substances.
 - b. Aerial reconnaissance to identify and inventory locations and activities associated with producing or trafficking controlled substances.
- 2.To reimburse <u>the Cooperator</u> for certain expenses resulting from investigative activities associated with investigating cases involving the illegal production or trafficking of controlled substances on or affecting the administration of National Forest System lands, including:
 - a. Surveillance operations to identify persons illegally producing or trafficking controlled substances.
 - b. Apprehension of persons suspected of producing or trafficking controlled substances.
 - c. Collection of evidence to support prosecution of persons suspected of illegally producing or trafficking controlled substances.
 - d. Prosecution of persons suspected of producing or trafficking controlled substances.
- 3.To reimburse <u>the Cooperator</u> for expenses resulting from the removal of cannabis plants from National Forest System Lands. When circumstances indicate that the removal of the cannabis plants is required before an investigation to determine the person(s) responsible can be completed, eradication operations must be approved by the USDA Forest Service prior to taking place.

Note: <u>The Cooperator</u> retains the authority to eradicate cannabis plants from National Forest System Lands without reimbursement from the USDA Forest Service at its discretion.



4.To reimburse <u>the Cooperator</u> for the cost of purchasing supplies and equipment used exclusively for activities described in items A.1, A.2 and A.3 of this Plan. Purchases must be agreed to and approved by the USDA Forest Service.

Purchases may **not exceed 10% of the total allocation** without prior approval by the USDA Forest Service Designated Representative.

B. **The Cooperator** agrees:

- 1. Within its capability, to perform the following activities on National Forest System lands:
 - a. Detect and inventory locations associated with illegal production or trafficking of controlled substances, and notify the USDA Forest Service of such locations as soon as possible.
 - b. Investigations to determine the person(s) responsible for manufacturing or trafficking controlled substances.
 - c. Upon request and prior approval of the USDA Forest Service, remove cannabis plants from the National Forest System lands.
- 2. To furnish all activity reports, crime reports, investigation reports, and other reports or records, resulting from activities identified in **Section II**, **A** of this Operating and Financial Plan to the affected Forests for review and forwarding to the Regional Office for processing.
- C. The *USDA Forest Service* and **the Cooperator** mutually agree to the following:
 - 1. The following rate schedule will apply to all expenditures that may be reimbursed to **the Cooperator** under this agreement:

Any remaining funding in this Operating Plan may be carried forward to the next fiscal year and will be available to spend through the term of the Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement, or de-obligated at the request of the USDA Forest Service. *See Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement Provision IV-C*.

IV. CLOSE OUT:

Final billing for reimbursement of this five-year Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement must be received by the USDA Forest Service no later than **120 days** from the agreement expiration date 09/30/2025.
