The Outpost M-R, LLC Agricultural Preserve Amendment and Williamson Act Contract Rescission and Reentry (APA2312)

The proposed amendment to an agricultural preserve and rescission of a Williamson Act contract with subsequent reentry in order to effectuate a proposed boundary line adjustment (BLA 2302) between two properties. The project site is located Stuart Springs Road, West of Old Highway 99, North and West of the city of Weed on APNs 020-160-230, 020-150-030, 020-150-011, 020-160-020, 020-160-171, 020-160-181, 020-160-190, 020-160-200, 021-130-021, 022-570-150 & 022-310-101; T42N, R5W, S 29, 30, 31, 32 & 33 and T42N, R6W S 25 & 36 and T41N, R5W, S4 & 6, MDB&M., (Latitude 41.444°, Longitude 122.443°).

It is anticipated that the proposed agricultural preserve and Williamson Act contract amendments will be determined to be categori-cally exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15317, Open Space Contracts or Easements. A "categori-cal exemption" certifies that the project will not result in any significant adverse environmental effect. The Board of Supervisors will consider the appropriateness of said environmental recommendation based on the record of evidence before them. If substantial evidence has been presented demonstrating a more appropriate environmental determination than the one that has been recommended, the Board of Supervisors may and/or approve an alternative environmental determination pursuant requirements of CEQA.

All project documents are on file at the Planning Division of the Siskiyou County Community Development Department and are available for public review. A staff report, and all attachments will be available for public review three working days prior to the Board of
