Summary

During Fiscal Year 2024–2025, the Communications & Telecommunications Department completed several key projects supporting critical infrastructure, public safety communications, and modernization efforts. This report outlines the Departments major accomplishments, including emergency response initiatives, radio and telecommunications upgrades, and facility support.

Major Accomplishments

1. Fire Command Repeater System Upgrade

- Replaced all nine Fire Command repeaters and one control station at nine different sites.
- ARPA-funded project; included antennas, power supplies, and associated components.
- New systems now meet all FCC requirements and recommendations.

2. Cal Fire Link Project

 Finalizing the installation of a new link between Cal Fire and the Fire Command control station, enhancing interagency coordination.

3. Repeater Site Maintenance

 Repaired one repeater building; two additional buildings are undergoing roof repairs with assistance from the DRC crew.

Major Accomplishments continued

4. County Security and Telecommunications Upgrades

- Upgraded camera systems at:
 - Sheriff's Office
 - Public Health
 - Department of Child Support Services (DCSS)
 - WIC Building
 - Government Center (in progress)
- Installed fiber optics from Planning to the newly leased ACS office.
- Completed network wiring for:
 - Probation's relocation to Charlie Bird
 - New IT offices
 - New DCSS building (over 100 network drops)
- Consulted with Facilities Director on rewiring the Government Center.
- Upgraded the call accounting server to improve management of county phone system records.
- Enabled the voicemail to email feature on the phone system.

Major Accomplishments continued

5. Radio System Installations and Maintenance

- Installed over 50 mobile radios in vehicles for:
 - Sheriff's Office
 - Probation Department
 - County Stage buses
 - Road Department
 - County Fire agencies
- Conducted winter follow-up inspections at all 15 repeater sites; repaired three repeaters.

Major Accomplishments continued

6. System Security and Encryption

- Most county radios and all repeaters were encrypted.
- Infrastructure now supports Sheriff's Office transition to the P-25 encryption standard.

7. Legacy System Resolution and Facility Enhancements

- Resolved a 30-year-standing issue within the Fire Command radio system.
- Installed a new audio system in the former boardroom to support county meetings.
- Replaced the repeatedly vandalized front entry phone system at the Sheriff's Office with a more durable communication and surveillance solution.

8. Emergency Response Support

- Successfully executed an emergency relocation of the Sheriff's 911 dispatch center to the basement of the Government Center.
- This was a first-of-its-kind operation for the county and required rapid deployment of network, radio, and phone systems.
- The temporary setup remained fully functional throughout the duration of repairs to the main dispatch facility and ensured uninterrupted emergency service operations.
- Kept up with the day to day work like moving phones, installing drops, changing names and passcodes for voicemail.

Future Project

- Refresh the Sheriff 911 system through AT&T and Motorola Vesta.
- Upgrade the Avtec system to make it possible to dispatch anywhere with a high speed internet connection.
- Add a repeater on Eddy Gulch for the Road department.
- Add a repeater on Antelope peak for the Sheriff's Department.
- Convert BHS Mt.Shasta to the county VOIP phone system.
- Rewire the old courthouse building for new network.
- Repair 2 repeater vaults.
- Rewire the electrical in the Happy Camp repeater vault and place a new electrical panel at Butcher Hill.
- Replace 2 out of 4 Ambulance repeaters.
- We would also like to get all County funded Fire departments new radios.
- Upgrade Road dept. camera system at the county yard.
- Upgrade camera system at BHS.






















Conclusion
