

**FOURTH ADDENDUM TO CONTRACT FOR SERVICES
BY INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR**

THIS FOURTH ADDENDUM is to that Contract for Services entered into on July 5, 2023, and as amended on August 1, 2023, July 25, 2024, and February 10, 2025, by and between the County of Siskiyou ("County") and M. Peters, Inc. ("Contractor") and is entered into on the date when it has been both approved by the Board and signed by all other parties to it.

WHEREAS, the Contract expired on June 30, 2025, and services continued to be required after that date; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to extend the term of the Contract;

WHEREAS, the cost of services to be provided under the Contract is expected to exceed the amount provided in the Contract; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to increase the amount of compensation payable under the Contract; and

WHEREAS, the Scope of Services, Exhibit "A", needs to be revised to reflect additional duties; and

NOW THEREFORE, THE PARTIES MUTUALLY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

Paragraph 1.01 of the Contract for Services shall be amended to extend the term of the Contract through September 30, 2025.

Paragraph 3.01 of the Contract, Scope of Services, shall be amended to repeal "Exhibit A" and replace it with the new "Exhibit A" attached hereto.

Paragraph 4.01 of the Contract, Compensation, shall be amended to add an additional One Hundred Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (135,000.00), to increase the compensation payable under the Contract to an amount not to exceed One Million Two Hundred Fifty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$1,255,000.00).

All other terms and conditions of the Contract shall remain in full force and effect.

 - all maintenance, fuel, greasing and fluid check will be included
- e) Full time Equipment operator (40 hours per week)
- f) Equipment operator to cover and stage loads for pick up.
- g) With the option of 2 hours over time at \$150.00 an hour per day.
- h) Working day will be Monday-Wednesday, Friday and Saturdays
- i) Closed all County Observed Holidays.

County and Mike Peters will communicate when and as services are needed.
